
Our Global Reputation

Study Abroad Programme

Our popular Study Abroad Programme offers students the opportunity to study at NUI Galway and earn credits towards their degree at their home institution. As a visiting student, you can attend NUI Galway for one semester (Fall or Spring) or a full academic year. Visiting students can take up to five or six classes per semester, from across a wide range of subject areas (subject to certain prerequisites), to meet their individual academic requirements. Bespoke classes are also offered to visiting students in Philosophical Thinking with Children, Irish Theatre and Indigenous Arts.



Marine Science and Biology



This practice-based programme studies marine life and environments, and associated biological components and interactions. Students will gain an understanding of how marine life is formed and evolves, and how it is affected by human activity, all set in the unique marine coastal environment of Galway Bay.

NUI Galway is the only Irish university offering a degree programme in Marine Science and it has the highest concentration of marine scientists of any institution in Ireland. Research ranges from fundamental studies of the marine ecosystem to co-operation with industry and state agencies. Our Ryan Marine Science Institute is home to most of the teaching and research activity in Marine Sciences at the university while our Marine Research Institute in Carna, County Galway carries out applied research.

The newly refurbished Zoology and Marine Biology Museum on campus, has over 500 specimens on display including a special collection of over 100 'Blaschka models'. These are intricate glass representations of marine animals that are used extensively in practical classes to examine characteristic features of species and broader taxonomic groupings at first hand, enhancing students skills in identifying a variety of specimens.

A form-and-function approach is taken linking in to the comparative ecology and evolution elements of the course, with students being able to directly compare homologous structures while considering the ecological requirements of the species.

Entry Requirements

Applicants are normally required to have completed two years study at a recognised college or university, with a minimum GPA of 3.0, to be admitted as a Visiting Student at NUI Galway.

How to Apply

Visiting Students can apply to NUI Galway through their home college or university, through a recognised third-party programme provider, or directly to the University.

All applications for admission as a Study Abroad student must be made on the official Visiting Student Application Form available at www.nuigalway.ie/international

The closing date for receipt of applications is 30th April for admission for a full academic year or Semester One and 31st October for Semester Two.

Academic Dates

NUI Galway operates a semester system. Semester One (Fall) begins in September with examinations in December. Semester Two (Spring) begins in January and runs until April, with examinations held in late April/early May. Exact dates can vary from year to year, so please refer to the University website for your particular semester(s).

Student Housing

Visiting students are housed alongside our regular full time students in various student residences.

NUI Galway student residences are self-catering apartments located within a 15-30 minute walk of campus. Apartment units usually include 2-3 bedrooms, shared cooking facilities and living space.
